7. No refunds of entry fees or stall fees will
be made where an entry is withdrawn by an
Exhibitor for any reason.
8. Entry fees and charges for stabling must be
forwarded with entry blank; otherwise, entries
will not be accepted.
9. All entries for exhibits of any kind or
character are subject to these regulations and
any violation will subject exhibitors to any
penalties the Executive Committee.
10. The management reserves the right to accept
or reject entirely, partially or conditionally any
entry or application. The management also
reserves the right to personally, or appoint a
committee to inspect all entries after they
have arrived, and dismiss any entries that
would discredit the Exposition.
11. The assignment of all stalls will be made by
the Draft Horse Show office.
12. Exhibitors will be required to attend to their
animals while on exhibition and to have them
presented to the judges when called for. Any
exhibitor who fails to present his animals in
the ring when the class is called to be judged
will be barred from the competition.
13. No livestock (for exhibit or sale) will be
released until the exhibitor presents a paid
feed bill and obtains a release from the Draft
Horse Office.
14. False representation, interference, or
ungentlemanly conduct by any exhibitor will
be dealt with by the Executive Committee
according to the equities of the case.
15. Substitutions will only be accepted for animals
with a veterinarian certificate and within
class. The substitute must be owned by the
same exhibitor.
16. Judges will not award prizes to any
unworthy exhibit. Animals must be shown
in such a manner as the judges require and
if the exhibitors refuse to submit to the
requirements of the judges, their animals will
be dismissed.
17. All animals must be exhibited before the judge in
the show ring, with entry number attached.
18. Premiums will be forwarded to the payee as
stated on the entry form, as soon after the close of
the Exposition as they can be properly processed.
Premiums are payable by bank check. All
premiums, whatsoever, not claimed by November
1 of the following year shall be deemed forfeited
to the management or donors.
19. All protests must be in writing and accompanied
by a deposit of \$500 which will be forfeited
if protest is not sustained. Such protest must
be delivered to the Manager within six hours
after the occasion of such protest, or if age is
brought into question, on day, prior to the one
on which the animals are to be judged. Protests
will be considered by the Executive Committee
as speedily as possible and their decision in the
matter shall be final.

SPECIAL DRAFT HORSE SHOW RULES

1. Registration papers will be checked by the
management of the show.
2. Every horse entered must pay a stall fee of \$20.00
per stall for the entire show.
3. For all hitch classes, the superintendent has the
right to have classes judged in sections with call
back privileges.
4. No person shall be permitted in the ring during
the time of judging, except the judges, clerks, ring
steward, official photographers, members of the
press and one groom with each exhibit. Grooms
should be attired in keeping with their exhibit.
5. Animals shall be shown to an appropriate wagon
or two-wheel cart, depending on the entry.
6. The driver and his/her assistant shall wear
appropriate neat and clean clothing, blue jeans
and bib overalls excluded.
7. If it shall be ascertained that any exhibitor,
exhibitor's helper or any spectator attempted
to interfere with the judge or manager in the
performance of his duties in any manner, or if any
exhibitor shall refuse to accept the awards made,
he shall be disqualified from further competition
and shall forfeit any premiums and ribbons
awarded him.
8. All entries shall be ready well in advance of
class time to avoid delays. **A maximum of ten
minutes will be allowed between the gate
call for the next class and entering that class.**
Hitches not ready shall not be allowed to show or
enter the ring once the time limit has expired and
the gate is closed.
9. Hitches may be made up of horses owned by one
or more exhibitors.
10. Hitches are judged for performance, driving and
conformation as noted in individual class description.

11. Definitions:
 - Performance: The animal(s) way of going: their
manner of prompt springy and snappy actions; the
individual and collective responses of the animal(s)
to the driver's verbal and manual signals. The overall
performance of the animals.
 - Driving: Ability of driver; the ease with which he puts
the animals through their paces and their response.
The working relationship between the driver and
animals.
 - Conformation: The overall appearance of the hitch;
matching of the animals in size, color and markings.
Animals should be compact and stylish, standing
squarely, being well muscled with clean bone and
joints.
12. Junior Driving Eligibility:
 - a. Drivers 18 years old and under Class 79.
 - b. One adult must accompany the driver
 - c. Junior drivers are not eligible for any other
driving class
 - d. Horses may be entered in other classes.
 - e. Class is judged on driving ability only.
 1. Proper commands
 2. Ability to change gaits
 3. Maneuver smoothly
 4. Continuity
13. Ride-A-Draft Class:
Horses and riders should be dressed in suitable
Western or English attire.
All riders must wear a western hat, tam or helmet.
Riders will be asked to walk, trot or jog in either
direction of the ring and to back. Class to be judged on
ability of horse and rider in their chosen discipline.
14. Pleasure Driving shall not be shown in patent
leather or scotch collars. To be driven to a
suitable pleasure type vehicle. Horses do not
need to be shod with scotch bottom shoes, keg
shoes are permissible. To be judged as a pleasure
type horse.
